

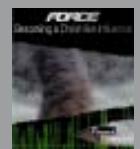

KEN'S PEN
Even a Fool Seems Wise

A father and his son brought a wagonload of garden produce into town for the purpose of trading it for necessary home supplies. As they neared their destination, the father pleaded with his son not to speak to the town's people: "If they talk with you for very long, they are likely to find out that you don't know much about their 'city ways,' and they will conclude that you are ignorant." After giving his son several warnings, the father left him with the wagon and went into the local store for supplies. When the father returned, however, he noticed an especially puzzled look on his son's face. "Son," the father inquired, "did you keep silent like I asked you to do?" "I sure did," said the boy, "but they found out I was ignorant anyway!"

"He who has knowledge spares his words, And a man of understanding is of a calm spirit. Even a fool is counted wise when he holds his peace; When he shuts his lips, he is considered perceptive" (Pro. 17:27-28). There are generally two ways that we can demonstrate wisdom to those around us: by having a good temper coupled with sweetness of mind; and by the close control of the tongue. The illustration above suggests that there are some things about us that people are going to find out regardless of how earnestly we try to conceal them. But, the point that is made by the father needs to be well taken: a wise person will be of few words, as being afraid of speaking without clarity.

The person who has knowledge, and aims to do well with it, is more likely to avoid the "foot-in-mouth" position than is the "gab artist" who speaks without thinking. This principle is so sure of foot (pun intended), that if a fool holds his peace, most people will think him wise because of a lack of evidence to the contrary.

Words are so powerful that silence is sometimes the wisest action. We have not mastered self-control so long as we leave our speech unguarded. Although the childhood rhyme states that "Words can never hurt me," the truth is that words can cut and destroy. James presented this truth when he stated, "The tongue is a fire, a world of iniquity" (Jas. 3:6). If you want to be self-controlled, begin with your tongue. Stop and think before you react or speak. If you can control this small but powerful member, you will save yourself and others from a world of hurt.
